Our Lady of Grace School is a Catholic co-educational, primary school catering to 540 children from Pre-Kindergarten to Year 6. The school was until recently owned by the Sisters of the Holy Family of Nazareth, an Order with a focus on love of God and one another, especially in ministry to the family. The school serves the Parish community of North Beach and surrounding suburbs. The school has a well-balanced curriculum with a focus on establishing a strong foundation in literacy and numeracy skills, as one of the keys to successful, lifelong learning. The school has extension programs as well as intervention and support programs ensuring the needs of every child are met. Music and Visual Arts are a feature of school life and the use of information technology is integrated into classroom teaching from Kindergarten through to the upper years. The pastoral care of the students lies at the heart of all that the school does. It is demonstrated through school policies and programs that encourage the development of self-discipline and self-belief and a close working relationship between school, home and parish. Our Lady of Grace School empowers all students through knowledge, faith and wisdom to live fulfilling lives in our ever changing world.

Based on the results of each of the five NAPLAN assessments to have to have no 'unfunded' student in the band labelled 'bottom 20% of Australian students'.

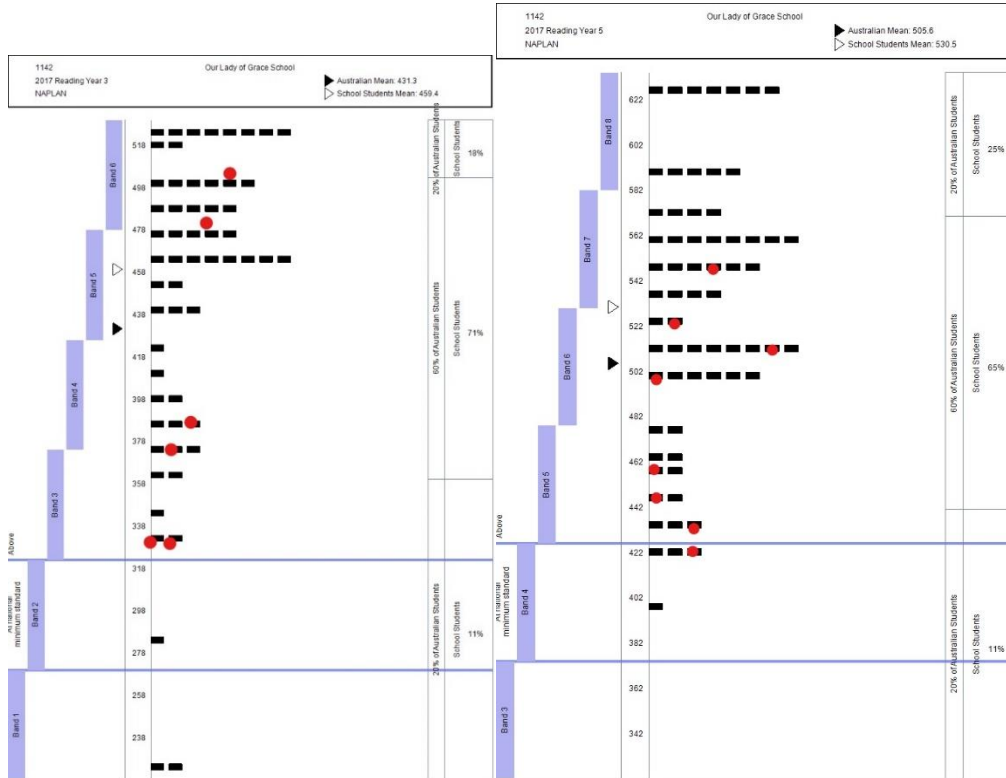
While we have not attained the goal we have made progress and performed well against the National Average.

One of our goals was to have no 'unfunded' child in the bottom 20%

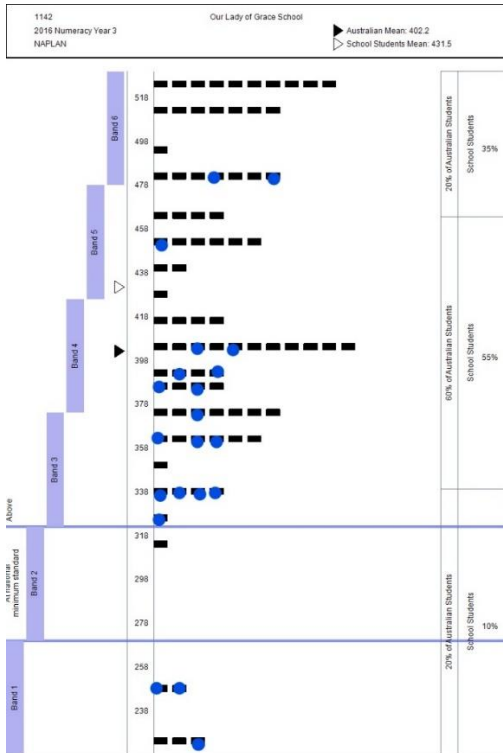

Bishops' Religious Literacy Assessment

Goal: Raise the school average in the Bishops' Literacy assessment to over 75%, with the expectation that 50% of Year 3 and 5 students score in the "top 20% band".

2017 Performance:

Year 3 average 64.2% with 42% of our students in top 20% bracket
Year 5 average 63.6% with 35% of our students in top 20% bracket
